For the Shabbos Table

In recounting the gifts of the Chanukas Hamizbaech, the Torah details each of the Nesiim's Korbanos, despite their Korbonos all being identical! Why would the Torah expend so many seemingly repetitive words?

The Darkei Mussar explains that human nature is such that we become less excited with repetition. One may think that a parent of many children would have less love for each individual child, compared to a parent with fewer children. However, we know that a parents love for their child remains consistnent, no matter how many children they may have. So too, whether 10 people are Davening in a Shul or 100 people, Hashem still values each and every person's Tefillah individually. The Torah is teaching us that to Hashem the 10th Nasi's Korbon was just as valuable and precious as the first, and therefore recounts it in full detail.

This should provide us with important chizzuk. We must know that in Shamayim our Mitzvos are never "lost in the shuffle" of the tzibbur's accomplishments; rather, they are weighed and valued individually.



Make sure to call your parents (and in laws), grandparents and Rebbi to wish them a good Shabbos. If you didn't speak to your kids today, make sure to do the same!
